Please keep to the marked paths at all times, and observe the Nature Photographers' Code of Practice set out by The Royal Photographic Society.

The further you walk on the **blue route** the less visitors you will encounter and the closer the display is to the path.

To allow social distancing and keep paths as narrow as possible, **please do not block paths** when you can see visitors approaching.

When lying down to get that perfect shot, please **make sure you are lying on the path** – as well as the thousands of flowering fritillaries there are many more thousands of non-flowering individuals, which look a lot like grass, at risk of being damaged.

Do not pick or uproot plants, it is an offence to do so.

Thank you for helping us prevent long-term damage to this internationally important habitat.
